## Funding Page

### South East regional bursary

The ASA South East Region is continuing with its funding for Swim21 clubs for 2011/12 through the Regional Bursary Scheme. Funding is available towards the cost of ASA/UKCC & SCUUK courses.

Awards will be made to off-set the cost of training and examinations. Maximum bursaries are:

- ASA/UKCC Level 1 courses 66%
- ASA/UKCC Level 2 courses 66%
- ASA/UKCC Level 3 courses 75%.

These bursaries will also support those candidates up-skilling from an old qualification to a new UKCC qualification

In line with the IoS online booking system the region will issue successful applicants with a voucher code to be used when booking this means all applications must be received and approved before candidate's book on the course. No retrospective funding will be awarded.

### Schweppes bursary

Further funding for up to 120 new swimming teachers and coaches is again available from The Swimming Trust who are working with Coca-Cola as part of its commitment to get people active on the road to 2012.

Launched in 2009, the partnership builds on the success of Coca-Cola's Schweppes Abbey Well Swim Free campaign to provide consumers with a free swim at participating pools in England, Scotland and Wales in exchange for promotional Schweppes Abbey Well bottle tops.

Coca-Cola have now committed a second donation of £50,000 to The Swimming Trust to projects to get Britain swimming. The money will be used for a Teacher Coach Education Grant Fund offering training opportunities for up to 120 volunteers within Swimming, Diving, Synchronised Swimming and Water Polo clubs across the UK.

### British Gas Club Grants

Swimming clubs around the country are being offered the chance to grab a grant worth up to £1,000 courtesy of British Gas.

The cash injection comes after the energy company earmarked £70,000 to help support club development up and down the country through the British Gas Club Mark Scheme underlining their commitment to grassroots and elite level swimming. The British Gas Club Grant is open to all swim21 accredited clubs and those clubs working towards accreditation and is a great way for clubs to increase membership or provide better opportunities for their members.

### Distance Meet Support 2011/12

In order to encourage clubs to run Distance Meets and reduce some of the financial burden, the ASA South East Region

Up to £500 per session long course  
Up to £350 per session short course

The aim of supporting these meets is to:

- Encourage swimmers to enter and compete in distance events
- Provide qualification opportunities for National Events
- Provide pool events for Open Water swimmers during the winter.
- Provide meets at Level 1 and Level 3 across the Region and spread through the year, taking into account the swimming calendar with County, Regional and National Competitions.

### Channel Island Qualification Support Scheme 2011/12

To enable swimmers from the Channel Islands to qualify for National Championships in Distance events the region is continuing its support scheme throughout 2011/12 by contributing to the expenses incurred in competing in Level 1 Licences Meets in order to qualify.

The Criteria for applications is:

- Organising clubs must have swim21 Accreditation.
- Swimmers must have already achieved the relevant qualifying time in a licensed meet in a short course pool.
- Meets must be licensed at Level 1 and in the time window needed for qualification.
- The support is to enable the swimmers to compete in 800m and/or 1500m free-style events at one meet (although they may also compete in other events at the same meet)

Support for a successful application will be for up to £150 for each swimmer to compete in one meet per year.

## Clubs news 2

Alex Murphy completes hat-trick of British Junior Records

Alex, 15, from Didcot Barramundi commenced his attack on the existing British Junior Breaststroke figures at the Oxfordshire & North Buckinghamshire Championships on 6<sup>th</sup> March at Aylesbury. Having just missed the 16 yr old Short Course Record in the 50m Breast Heats in the morning he set new figures of 28.96 in the Final.

Alex then moved on to the South East Region Youth Championships at Crawley and on the 1<sup>st</sup> May he broke the British Junior Long Course 50m Breast Record in the Heats with a swim in 29.73 and then bettered it with a Final swim of 29.71.

Returning to a Short Course pool at Hatfield on the 15<sup>th</sup> May Alex broke the 100m Breast British Junior Record with a swim of 1.02.82.

Not bad !10 weeks, 3 British Junior Records and still 4 weeks before Alex turns 16 !!

### Masters News

#### MASTERS NEWS OPEN 2011

South East Region (SER) Masters open events continue to attract good entries and have become firmly established in the Masters calendar. The Long Course Masters at the end of January provides an early opportunity to set records for those who have moved up an age group at the start of the year. This year it was held on 29th & 30th January at the K2 centre. There were 406 individual entrants and 70 relay team entries. 59 Masters records were broken, 30 individual of which Jane Asher accounted for 21, and 29 relay team records. Included in these records were 7 World records and 18 European records.

On September 24th the SER Short Course Masters will be at the Aldershot Garrison Sports Centre for the first time. This venue was chosen after favourable reports were received about the pool following the successful Masters Inter County held there in November 2010. With the pool in 2 x 25m configuration there is a 25m warm up and swim down pool available during the whole meet, and being relatively close to the M3 access is convenient for many. Entry details will be published on the SER web site. After the successful trial of the on-line entry system at the Long Course meet, the Short Course meet entry will be by on-line only.

The SER Inter County Masters will be held on 13th November 2011 at the Surrey Sports Park, Guildford.

Dates for the various county Masters competitions will be published on the web site as they become known.

### Diving News

**Surrey diving officials accredited by Fina**  
TWO officials from Surrey diving clubs have been certified internationally by world governing body Fina. Francisco Diaz of Star Diving Club in Guildford, and Stacia Long, head coach at Merton School of Diving, were among candidates from Great Britain, Ireland and Bermuda in attendance at the course at the end of January.

Fina technical diving committee members Anke Piper, of Germany, and Frans Van De Konijnenburg, of the Netherlands, presented the three-day judging seminar at the new facility in Southend-on-Sea, hotly tipped to be one of the main athlete training centres in the run-up to next year's London Olympics. The course coincided with the first major fixture of the year – the GB National Cup.

Among the competition highlights were Southampton Diving Academy's Peter Watefield and Plymouth Diving's Tom Daley competing together for the first time in the men's 10m synchro event. The pair were performing forward 4½ somersaults with tuck – currently one of the most difficult dives from this height.

Participants spent the first two days in the classroom going over core theory, including the international rules, and culminating with a written examination paper. That was followed by a number of practical sessions on poolside, shadow judging the main competition and then being evaluated at the end.

"I was completely overwhelmed to have been invited in the first place," said Fran. "I enjoyed every minute of it. It hasn't sunk in yet that I have passed."

### Practice What They Preach

The South East team have been working hard with Local Authorities and Pool Operators over the last 6 months to support them in driving up swimming participation within their centres as part of the ASA objective to get 270,000 more people swimming three times a week. The team decided that it was time they became one of the 5 million adults that take the plunge. In December the team set off on three virtual challenges; swimming the English Channel, swimming around the Isle of Wight and finally swimming the length of the River Thames. The team have succeeded in collectively completing both the English Channel and the trip round the Isle of Wight and are approaching the half way point on the Thames.

For Sarah Porter and Natalie Cunningham the challenge required an additional motivation. Raising money for Marie Curie, a cause close to both their hearts, ticked all the boxes. The duo joined thousands of other swimmers in the South East and completed the Swimathon 2.5K challenge. The duo completed their distance in 47minutes and managed to raise £300, gaining contributions from supportive friends, family and even old colleagues.

With extra motivation gained from the fundraising efforts of their colleagues, the team now strive forward in their quest to complete the length of the Thames, hopefully they will see the Olympic Park before the games begin, only 200km to go!! It is worth reminding intending competitors that early entry is advisable as many events are oversubscribed and the Region has no control over entries for any event other than its own.

Next year will see some changes. The Championships will move to July and new Championship distances of 1.5K, 1.75K, 2K and 3K will be introduced.

This is to meet the requirements of allowing the Regional Champion in the appropriate age/distance to qualify for the National Age Group Championships without having to achieve the pool qualifying time as every entrant has to do at the moment:

Girls 12/13 years & Boys 12-14 years - 1500m

Girls 14/15 years & Boys 15/16 years - 1750m

Girls 16/17 years & Boys 17/18 years - 2000m

3000m awaiting clarification
